This COC authorizes the permittee to discharge biological pesticides and pesticide residues resulting from the application of chemical pesticides (hereinafter collectively referred to as "pesticides") to control nuisance plants and algae in, over, or near surface waters of the State of Michigan. Consistent with the criteria and requirements established in General Permit No. MIG031000, the permittee is authorized to discharge pesticides to the following surface waters of the State of Michigan located within the identified Pest Management Area:

Pest Management Area(s):
Gladwin and Midland counties

Waterbodies:
Former bottomlands of Sanford Lake, Secord Lake, Smallwood Lake, and Wixom Lake

The permittee is authorized to use and discharge residues of the pesticides described in their approved Workplan and Pesticide Discharge Management Plan (PDMP). However, the Basic Formulation of Vastlan Herbicide (EPA Reg. No. 62719-37) is not authorized for use by this permit.

Unless specified otherwise within the General Permit, all contact with the Department shall be to the staff contact for Pesticide Control within the Water Resources Division. Any person who is aggrieved by this COC may file a sworn petition with the Michigan Administrative Hearing System within the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, c/o the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, setting forth the conditions of the COC that are being challenged and specifying the grounds for the challenge. The Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs may reject any petition filed more than 60 days after issuance as being untimely.

The issuance of this COC does not authorize violation of any federal, state, or local laws or regulations, nor does it obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits, including any other Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy permits, or approvals from other units of government as may be required by law.

This COC is based on a complete application submitted on May 27, 2022. The permittee is subject to the conditions specified in General Permit No. MIG031000, issued September 29, 2021, expiring February 1, 2027. This COC may be modified, terminated, reissued, or revoked as allowed for in General Permit No. MIG031000.

This COC takes effect on the date of issuance.
